Poll workers are the people that make Election Day happen. Elections would not be possible without the help and support of poll workers. No experience is necessary as your local election official will teach you everything you need to know to do the job.



POLL WORKERS MUST BE:

- A United States Citizen
- At least 16 years old
- A resident of North Dakota

Being a poll worker is one of the most rewarding ways you can help your community get out and vote. It is an opportunity to be involved in the election process and ensure that polling locations are open in your community.

EASY AS 1-2-3

YES! I WANT TO BE A POLL WORKER.

Becoming a poll worker is as easy as saying, YES! After you complete the form in this brochure and return it, your local election official will reach out and let you know more about upcoming training prior to the election.

1. ATTEND TRAINING

Your election official will notify you of a training class to give you instructions on poll worker duties. Trainings are typically no more than two-hours.

2. SET UP THE ELECTION

On the day of the election, you will help set-up the polling location you will work at before your friends and neighbors arrive to vote.

3. HELPING VOTERS

Once the polling location opens, you may help voters in a variety of ways:

- checking voter in
- handing out ballots
- addressing questions
- assisting with equipment

You will also help your fellow poll workers close down the polls at the end of the day.
